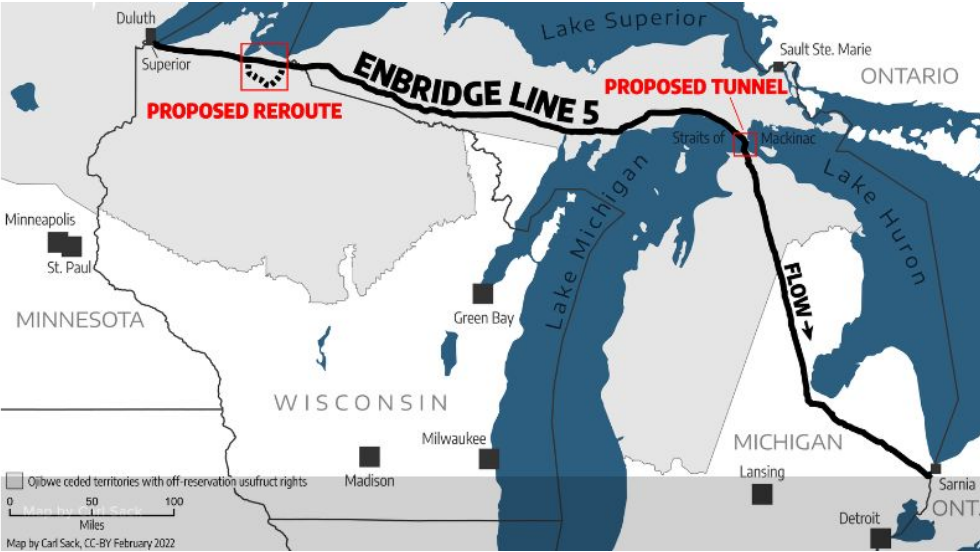
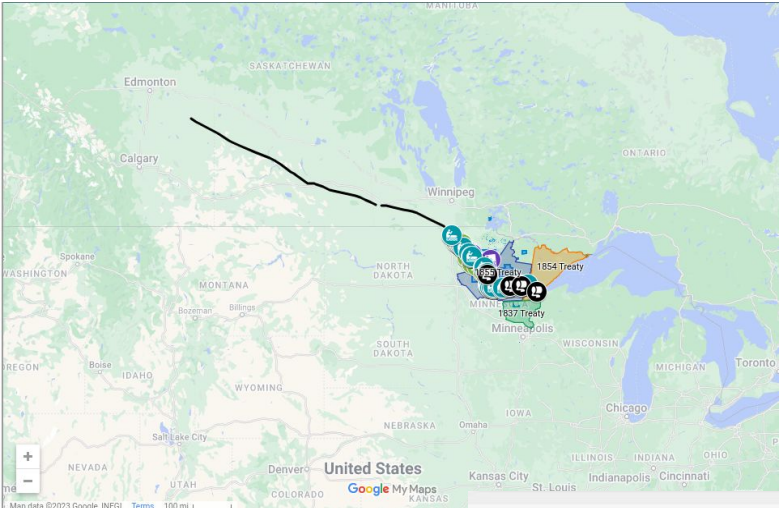

What is Line 3 and Line 5 ?

Accordingly to stopline3.org - Line 3 is proposed pipeline that expands to bring a million of tar sand per day from Alberta to Canada, Superior and Wisconsin. Proposed by a Canadian pipeline company called Enbridge built in the 1960s.

Line 5 is pipeline that is owned by Enbridge built in 1950s. 540,000 barrels of tar sand oil from Superior, Wisconsin to Sarnia, Ontario



What is the problem ?

Company

Enbridge is a pipeline company that uses energy from parts of America such as oil, gas etc. Enbridge has put these pipelines on Indigenous land and their clean water, healthy food. Enbridge has over 300 reported oil spills across U.S.

Food and water
